Greek Prefixes: di, dif, dis

Disturb - to stop (someone) from working, sleeping, etc. : to interrupt or bother (someone or something)

I'm sorry to disturb you at such a late hour.

Direct - to cause (someone or something) to turn, move, or point in a particular way

Lights were directed [=aimed] toward the paintings on the wall.

Dissolve - to mix with a liquid and become part of the liquid

Sugar/salt dissolves in water.

Differ -to have opinions that don't agree

We differ [=disagree] on how best to raise the money.

Disposal -the act of disposing of something: such as

the act of throwing something away

trash disposal

Dissatisfied - not happy or pleased

dissatisfied customers

Disqualified - to stop or prevent (someone) from doing, having, or being a part of something

His poor eyesight disqualified him from becoming a pilot.

Disapprove - to believe that someone or something is bad or wrong : to not approve of someone or something

Dishonor - loss or lack of honor : damage to your reputation and loss of respect from other people

Disability - the condition of being unable to do things in the normal way **:** the condition of being disabled

It's a serious disease that can cause a disability.
