<u>dehydrated</u> – adj. the state in which a large amount of water has been lost or removed from the body or from food. Dehydrated fruit makes a great snack. When Janie had the stomach flu, she became dehydrated.

<u>hydrant</u> – n. a pipe in or near the street that provides water, especially for putting out fires. There are twelve fire hydrants on Main Street.

hydrate – v. to add water or moisture to something; to supply something with water. After being in the sun, it's important to hydrate your skin with lotions, gels, or creams.

<u>hydraulic</u> – adj. operated by the pressure of a fluid. An airplane is controlled using an extensive hydraulic system.

hydroplane – v. to slide on a wet road because a thin layer of water on the road causes the tires to lose contact with it. You must be careful when driving in rain so that your car does not hydroplane.

Aquatic – adj. having to do with water.

Aqueduct – a pipe or channel that leads to water to certain places.
